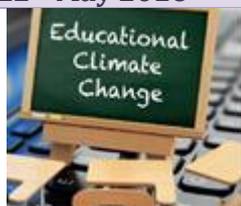

**National Forum Seminar: Coordinating the Programme Team for Assessment and Feedback**



The next National Forum seminar at DIT will take place at DIT Kevin St on **6<sup>th</sup> May 2016 from 9.30am to 3.30pm**, on the topic **Coordinating the Programme Team for Assessment and Feedback**. **Dr Mark Kerrigan**, Director of Learning and Teaching, Anglia Ruskin University ([mapmyprogramme.com](http://mapmyprogramme.com)) and **Dr Alan Masson** of Blackboard Inc. will lead this event. The design of assessment and feedback across the modules and stages of a programme should look beyond the atomic assessment of individual modules and consider the overall objectives of the programme, including programme learning outcomes and graduate attributes. This seminar will examine and provide training of a number of collaborative assessment planning tools currently available, including the Greenwich University [MapMyProgramme tool](#). There will also be an opportunity to be involved in participatory design of the next generation of tools to support programme teams in the design of their assessment and feedback activity.

## Dublin e-Learning Summer School 2016



The **Dublin eLearning Summer School** is now in its 14th year and since 2003 has provided participants with a forum through which to experience, explore and learn more about both existing and emerging technologies, and to consider how best to integrate them into their teaching, learning and assessment practices. This year we aim to bring these conversations on further and consider the wider issues that can affect our ability, at both an institutional and individual level, to provide appropriate, high quality, flexible and online learning opportunities for our students. The theme is **Ethics and eLearning**, a theme that is timely as many higher education institutions increase their efforts to exist effectively and appropriately in the online space. The topics to be explored include copyright and e-learning; the effective and ethical use of learning analytics; privacy and data protection; digital footprints; and academic integrity in a digital age.”

Una will discuss some preliminary research which has been carried out to ascertain if Problem Based Learning is an effective way to enhance Graduate Attributes. It reports on the outcome of a design project module where students were given an open ended problem – to design a bridge to span 6m over a river for use in emergency situations in Nairobi.
