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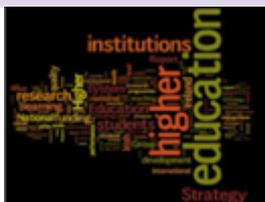
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The LTTC has moved!



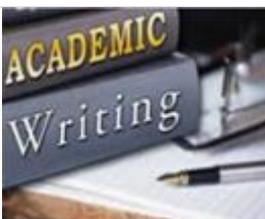

Higher Education Policy (10 ECTS)

- Would you like to know more about HE policy development within a national and international context? Heard about the Hunt report, Bologna Process and HEA Institutional performance compacts but not sure how they might impact upon local strategic decisions and resourcing and the quality of learning and teaching?
- This Continuing Professional Development short course provides participants with an opportunity to develop a personal perspective on a selected range of HE issues through a series of interactive seminars with key policy makers.
- Sessions run **10am – 1pm on Tuesdays**: 21st October, 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th November, and 2nd December for 6 weeks.

- Writing is at the heart of academic life, but it can sometimes seem impossible to find time and space to get it done. So to best fit in with a busy academic's schedule, we have designed this module to be both flexible and motivational to suit your writing needs. A series of tutorials starts **Tuesday 28th October** (10am-1pm & 2-5pm) and continues on subsequent Tuesdays on 25th

November (2-5pm), 9th December (10am -1pm & 2-5pm), 20th January (10am-1pm) and 24th February (2-5pm).

- This module is best suited to those who have sufficient data to write a paper suitable for submission for publication.
- There are two practical and useful outputs from the module – each participant will write a paper for submission for publication in a peer reviewed journal and be invited to make a conference presentation at our annual Graduate Conference which will take place in 2015 on June 16th.
- The closing date for applications is **October 21st**.

Research and Awards

DIT Teaching Fellowship Projects 2014-15

- This year's call for Teaching Fellowships focused on supporting collaborative work to enhance learning and/or curriculum development at a programme or cross-institutional level.
- Seven Fellowship projects have been funded, two in CoAT, one in CoB, one in CEBE and three in CoSH.
- The Fellowships will be formally launched by **Dr Muiris O'Connor** of the HEA on **Tuesday 21st October** in Aungier Street – please watch for further details of this event.
- The launch event will also include dissemination of the **2013-14 Fellowships Report**. Chapters documenting individual Fellowship projects from each of the previous reports [have recently been published on Arrow](#). The LTTC would like to thank Yvonne Desmond and her colleagues in the Library very specially for their great assistance with this work.



DIT SEED funded Learning Teaching & Assessment Projects

- This year's call was for studies likely to lead to developments in teaching practice and methodology aligned with the current strategic priorities of DIT and in the establishment of the TU4Dublin.
- The review panel comprised representatives from ITTD, DIT REIS, LTTC, DITSU and College Heads of Learning Development. 12 project applications were received. Eight projects were successful in obtaining funding: one from CoAT, two from CEBE and four from CoSH.
- A range of projects were funded including **Bridging the Gap** to engage first year students, an **online TU French grammar open resource** initiative, the **MEET project** to maximise Erasmus exchange student support, **Source mobile app** to support student study strategies and **Hitting new ground running**, pre-entry support for international students.

- The National Forum announced its inaugural **Teaching Heroes** award winners on Tuesday 30th September at a ceremony in Dublin Castle: congratulations to **Bryan Duggan** (School of Computing), and **Pat Hannon**, (School of Media Studies) were the DIT recipients.

- Meanwhile, the Forum has announced the list of collaborative enhancement projects moving through to the second phase of assessment under its **Building Digital Capacity** theme.
- 19 of 33 projects submitted have reached this second phase, and DIT is leading on two of these including one initiative with our TU4D partners. The projects are **Team-based Programme (re)development initiative (TBPRDI)** and **Playful Transitions**.
