First Year Tutors Light Lunch Series 2014-15

A series of 6 '**Transition into Higher Education**' light lunch sessions for staff involved in teaching and supporting first years took place at a range of DIT campuses over this academic year. In total, 32 academic staff and 30 professional support staff attended. The sessions were organised by **Rachel O'Connor (Campus Life)** and **Claire McDonnell (LTTC)** and provided an opportunity for those teaching first years to; (i) meet each other and discuss common concerns as well as good practice and opportunities for collaboration and (ii) meet with professional support staff face to face and obtain information on the services available to students and relevant contact details (e.g. Career Development Centre, Student Services, Medical Centre, Financial Aid, Disability Support Service, International Office, Access and Civic Engagement, Library Services).



Light Lunch in Kevin St

Based on requests for information from tutors, in Semester 1, an input was provided from Student Services on advising students on withdrawal and deferral processes. In Semester 2, inputs were provided on establishing boundaries when dealing with students in distress, financial aid and on supporting international students. This was the second light lunch series and a third is planned with sessions in November 2015 and March 2016.

Special Event: Academic Development – a forecast and guide to the years ahead

Colleagues with interests in teaching and learning, and the wider field of academic development, are invited to a special event on Thursday 7th May looking at the future of this area.

Three education networks, [EDIN](#), [AISHE](#) and [INew](#) have organised this event in collaboration. We look forward to welcoming **Professor Mary Deane Sorcinelli** of UMass Amherst to DIT for this session. The event will also include the launch of the [EDIN/AISHE-J Special Issue](#) which was published recently.

This will be a research-based session in which we will discuss key findings from an extensive 2012 survey of academic developers in North America (U.S. and Canada). We'll focus on emerging trends in personnel, priorities, structures, practices, and directions of teaching and learning centres. Participants will consider how to best guide our centres and support our institutions in creating new solutions to emerging challenges.
